Re: NYC's Covid-19 Zone Finder (as of 12/14/20)

With New York State imposing [major new restrictions in coronavirus hotspots](#) in Brooklyn, Queens and Staten Island, through the creation of a three-tier zone mapping system, there has been some confusion over the areas impacted and questions on enforcement in these neighborhoods. To learn whether your residence is located in a zone, visit the [online mapping tool](#) prepared by the city.

Per [State guidance](#), modifications have been made to the COVID Zone on Staten Island, and new Zones have been added in Manhattan and the Bronx. These changes are reflected in the updated map and are spelled out below with their effective dates.

Manhattan COVID Zones:

- Effective November 25, a yellow zone, which covers a large portion of upper Manhattan, has been added. (Effective date for non-public schools is November 26)

Staten Island COVID Zones:

- Effective November 25, the entire borough of Staten Island has been covered by either an orange or a yellow zone. (Effective date for non-public schools in portions of Staten Island with zone color changes is November 26)

Bronx COVID Zones:

- Effective November 19, two yellow zones, which cover large portions of the Bronx, have been added.

Brooklyn COVID Zones:

- Effective November 19, the orange zone has moved to yellow.
- Effective November 19, the pre-existing yellow zone has been removed.

Queens COVID Zones:

- Effective November 19, the Queens yellow zone has been expanded.

We need all New Yorkers to step up and prevent the spread of COVID-19 in NYC!

Take These Steps:

- Stay home if you're sick
- Keep physical distance
- Wear a face covering
- Keep your hands clean
- Get Tested: Find a testing site at nyc.gov/covidtest
